Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constables (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs), all under the command of an Inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us

Driffield Community Officers and Special Constables have continued their patrols around the "hotspot areas" regarding ASB, SHOPLIFTING within the town centre.

Community Officers have been attending both Beeford and North Frodingham Junior schools to do the Mini Police project.

The Mini Police project is a fun and interactive volunteering opportunity for 9- to 11-year-old children and is designed to increase engagement and breakdown barriers.

Driffield officers are continuing to work alongside local youth groups/workers. Further funding has been secured to continue working alongside Driffield Youth action Group to try and combat the continuing Anti-Social Behaviour within the town. A multi-Sports Evening for 11 – 18-year-olds this is between 1900x2000 at the Driffield sports Centre (Astro turf) this is held every Friday.

Driffield Officers have been working closely with the Rural Task Force on OP GALILEO to combat Hare Coursing around the Driffield Countryside.

Five men have pleaded guilty to hare coursing, have been ordered to pay over £3400 in fines and disqualified from keeping sighthounds following their appearance at Beverley Magistrates Court on Monday 8 January in connection with an incident in November 2022. On Sunday 6 November 2022, officers were called to Grange Lane in North Frodingham following reports of a group of men hare coursing.

Two men have been charged following three knife point robberies in Hull last week. Darren Johnson, aged 33, of Cyprus Street, Hull has been charged with three counts of robbery and two counts of possession of a bladed article and is due to appear at Hull Magistrates Court Harris Sunborg, aged 24, of Schofield Avenue, Beverley was charged with robbery and remanded into custody.

On Tuesday 9 January and Thursday 11 January two men are reported to have entered shops on Preston Road and Marfleet Lane in Hull and threatened staff with a knife before fleeing the scene with money, alcohol, and cigarettes.

In a third incident, on Friday 12 January a man is reported to have entered a shop on Marfleet Lane and threaten staff with a knife before fleeing the scene with money.

An organised crime group involved in producing and distributing an estimated 2.4 million pounds worth of cannabis across the communities of Hull and the East Riding are due to be sentenced after being found guilty at Hull Crown Court following a complex three-year investigation into the gang's activities.

The four men appeared at Hull Crown Court for an 11-week trial after being charged with a series of offences for their involvement in using multiple properties to harvest and sell drugs in our communities whilst making an estimated 2.4 million pound profit every 11-13 weeks.


Ervis Mrisgai, aged 25 of Peterborough was charged with two counts of conspiracy to produce Class B drugs and was found guilty of both offences.

Florjan Kasaj, aged 41, of Buckingham Street, Hull was charged with conspiracy to produce Class B drugs and money laundering and found was guilty of conspiracy to produce Class B drugs.

Dardan Mrishaj, aged 37, of Duesbery Court in Hull was charged with two counts of conspiracy to produce Class B drugs and possession of a taser and was found guilty of two counts of conspiracy to produce Class B drugs.

Jeremy Southgate, aged 63, of Brough was summonsed and charged with two counts of conspiracy to produce Class B drugs, money laundering, two counts of fraud by false representation and found guilty of all offences.

APPEALS

A man aged 28 has been arrested after a man sustained a serious head injury in Goole during the early hours of yesterday morning (Monday 1 January).

We were called to reports that two men had been involved in an altercation at around 2.50am on Aire Street resulting in a 20-year-old man reportedly being assaulted.

The man aged 20 was taken to hospital to receive medical treatment for a fractured skull which is thankfully not thought to be life threatening at this time.

A 28-year-old man was arrested nearby on suspicion of grievous bodily harm and remains in our custody whilst we continue to conduct lines of enquiry.

Detective Inspector Paul Farmer said: "We are currently in the early stages of our investigation, but I would like to reassure people that we do believe this to be an isolated incident.

"As part of our investigation, a scene guard remained in place to allow detectives to follow lines of enquiries. I would ask anyone who has any concerns to please do come speak to us.

"I would encourage anyone who may have information or has CCTV or dashcam footage that may assist with our enquiries to please contact us on our non-emergency number 101 quoting log 164 of 1 January." Alternatively, you can contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Can you help officers identify the man in these images as a part of an ongoing investigation into a road traffic collision on the M62 eastbound, near to the Glews services, on Sunday 13 August 2023. It is reported at around 3.10pm, two cars were involved in a collision before a man is believed to have fled the scene.




