Three men have pleaded guilty to multiple hare coursing offences and have been ordered to pay over £1000 in fines, following their appearance at Hull Magistrates Court on Wednesday 3 April and Friday 5 May in connection with an incident in November 2023. All three men pleaded guilty to hunting wild mammals with dogs, trespassing with intent to search for or to pursue hares with dogs, being equipped to trespass with intent to search for or to pursue hares with dogs, and trespassing on a railway.

Joel Miller, aged 27, of Rhyl, North Wales has also been fined £199, issued a community order, required to undertake 120 hours unpaid work, and disqualified from driving for 42 days.

James Callaghan, aged 46 of Cliveden Road, Chester was also fined £199, issued a community order, required to undertake 120 hours unpaid work, excluded from entering the East Riding of Yorkshire for 12 months, the exclusion from entering the East Riding of Yorkshire is a first for Humberside Police outside any criminal behaviour, order as well as a forfeiture order for the destruction of recording devices.

Connor Waring, aged 25, of Surrey Road, Chester has also been fined £624.

On Sunday 5 November 2023, officers were called to land near Rawcliffe Bridge following reports of a group of men hare coursing.

The rural task force was deployed and using a Humberside Police drone and high powered 4x4 vehicles, all three men were located with dogs described as running dogs on the land without permissions and arrested at the scene.

We always encourage those who are victims or rural crime to come forward and be assured that we will support them with pursuing offenders, securing convictions and making our rural areas safer to live and work.

Illegal Electric Scooters: Know the Law & Stay Safe!

Thinking about hopping on that electric scooter for a joy ride? Hold on! Before you do, let's talk legality and safety.

Legality Alert: Did you know that many electric scooters are illegal to use on public roads and sidewalks in the UK? It's true! According to UK law, most e-scooters are classified as motor vehicles, meaning they must meet certain requirements to be used legally. Using illegal scooters can result in fines, points on your license, and even confiscation of the scooter! Don't risk it!

Safety First: Illegal e-scooters aren't just breaking the law; they can also put you in serious danger! From poor quality construction to lack of proper safety features, these scooters pose significant risks to riders and pedestrians alike. Protect yourself and others by choosing safe, legal transportation options.

Eye-opening Statistics: In Great Britain in 2022, there were a staggering 1,492 casualties involving e-scooters, including 17 fatalities and 484 serious injuries. This represents a significant increase compared to the previous year, where there were only 10 casualties reported in 2021. These numbers underscore the importance of using e-scooters responsibly and legally to prevent accidents and tragedies.

On the evening of Friday 3 May, our Night Challenge participants gathered at Brantingham Park to commemorate all their hard work across the event. Every year, Night Challenge takes place across Brantingham Dale with the intention of building positive relationships between the police and young people within harder to reach groups across our communities as they complete a variety of exercises in their teams. This year's theme focused on child criminal exploitation and knife crime. Hosted by Chief Inspector Mark Lovell from our Community Safety Unit, the evening saw teams who took part in the event on Saturday 16 March celebrating their participation. In attendance with them were their families, who were given the chance to see the beneficial impact which the event had. It was also an opportunity for our event hosts, and the young people who took part, to say thank you to everybody who got involved in the evening, such as the event sponsors and volunteers. Each team is marked on well how they worked together as a team including their communication skills across the night and how well they tackled the tasks together based on feedback from the challenge providers. From this, the top three winning teams are decided – or four in this year's instance! Awarded by Assistant Chief Constable Lisa Hogan, we had a tie for our first-place winners – The Man Hunters and VPP Lads, who were awarded with a five-day trip to Mount Cook where they will get to take part in a whole host of fun and creative activities! As part of the night, attendees also heard from a victim of child criminal exploitation who spoke about their own experience with the crime. They received a staggering number of cheers and applause throughout, emphasising how well those in the room resonated with their words. Community Engagement Coordinator, and lead for Night Challenge, Katie Hardy said: "The evening was a great opportunity to reunite with everyone who was involved with the event, as well as meet the young people's families and share all the fantastic stories from that evening. "Night Challenge is a hugely successful event which provides these children with the chance to spend time with officers, whilst they build their confidence and develop life skills in different surroundings. "It means they can build bonds with the police and break down barriers, and I'm confident this will be an experience they carry with them for a long time after."



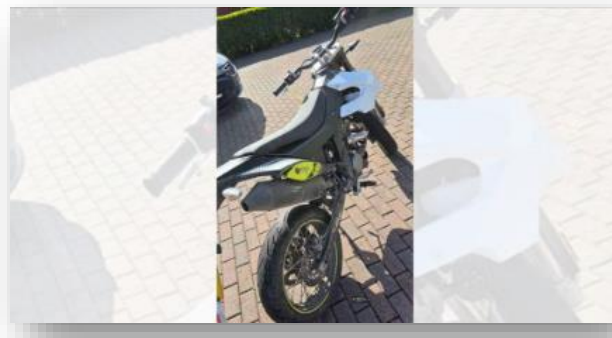

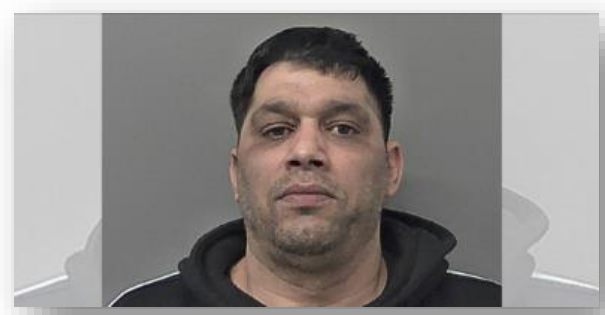

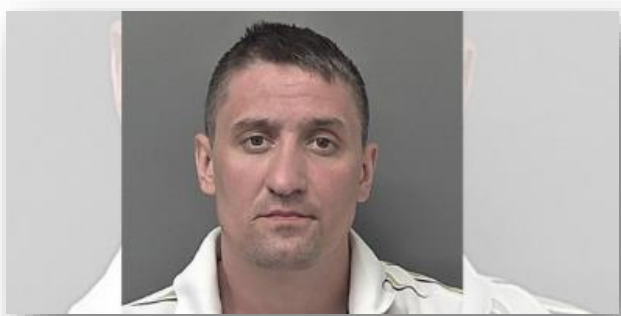

General Information & Crime Prevention

Do you want to find out what is happening in your local area?

Our community alert system, called **My Community Alert**, allows you to register to receive real time messages about incidents happening in your neighbourhood that may affect you or your family.

Sign up today - you can choose how you would like to receive messages (text, voicemail or email), how often you would like to receive alerts and which issues matter most to you, from collisions and road closures to missing people.

Protect yourself from investment scams:

- Consider that if an individual or organisation contacts you randomly about an investment opportunity, it is likely to be either a scam or an investment carrying high risk
- Consider that in the UK, almost all financial services firms must be authorised by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA), which operates the Financial Services Register and Consumer Helpline. Details can be found on the Get Safe Online website
- Learn to spot the classic signs of an investment fraud, such as unrealistically high returns (although this is not always the case), undue pressure or limited time offers. Over-familiarity or flattery, absence of a physical address or being requested to provide remote access to your device
- If you receive a cold call offering an investment, do not engage in conversation, but instead end the call by either disconnecting straight away, or after saying "No thanks, I'm not interested."
- If you receive an online or text communication about an investment, ignore it and if it's an email, delete it. Do not click on any links or attachments
- Consider registering with the Telephone Preference Service and Mailing Preference Service to reduce the number of unsolicited calls and letters you receive
- Callers may pretend they are not cold calling you by referring to a brochure or an email they have already sent
- Ignore unsolicited offers of help in recovering money you have lost to a scam, as this will undoubtedly be another scam
