### Driffield Community Team

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constables (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs), all under the command of an Inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us

#### Humbertalking -

Humber Talking is still being undertaken in the Driffield and surrounding villages. Speaking to members of the public who want to take part. **Driffield officers** - Continue to attend several village locations with the SID (Speed Identification Device) to collect data on speeding issues, this data is passed on to partner agencies for possible action if required.

Officers from our neighbourhood policing teams have been carrying out activity as part of National Retail Crime Month.

Throughout the month of March our teams visited over 2,000 shops offering businesses advice to help the protect themselves as well taking action against anyone suspected of committing a retail related offence.

Inspector Jon Powell said: "Throughout the month our teams were busy conducting patrols to target those causing the greatest impact to businesses, whilst also helping retailers understand the range of support available to them to help keep their premises and staff safe.

"Our Neighbourhood Policing Teams also offered wider crime prevention support, including carrying out HumberTalking and registering people for our My Community Alert system.

"I hope our activity last month sent a clear message to anyone planning to commit crime against our local businesses. This offending will not be tolerated, and we will be proactive in holding those responsible to account to keep our shop workers safe."

### GPS thefts

Due to a recent spike in GPS thefts around the country and neighbouring forces please read the below advice.

We recognise that the theft of agricultural GPS receivers and screens are a national priority across the country and a local priority for the force.

The impact caused to the farming community cannot be underestimated, whether it be the emotional cost from being a victim of rural crime, to the financial cost of replacing the high value assets.

Humberside Police are committed to responding to such crime trends through pro-active and re-active measures with sharing information and intelligence with partners, high visibility patrolling in our rural areas by our Rural Task Force team and using the latest forensic property marking solutions to allow stolen property to be quickly identified and returned to owners.

Our aim is to disrupt, apprehend and prosecute the organised crime groups involved in these thefts and to prevent the farming community from becoming victims of rural crime. Simple crime prevention steps can be taken with our message MARK IT, REMOVE IT and LOCK IT.

### Tractor GPS Screens

- Remove screens when not in use – ensure they are left in a safe and secure location.
- Mark screens using Forensic Marking and use the provided stickers to advertise forensic marking is in use
- Record serial numbers

### Tractor GPS Receivers

- If not in use, disconnect, remove and secure in a safe location
- Remove from roof if not in use and tractor is being used on road – this will prevent advertising the fact you have a receiver.
- Ensure the software is up to date, and marked with security warning stickers
- Consider securing the tractor in a locked alarmed shed
- Record serial numbers

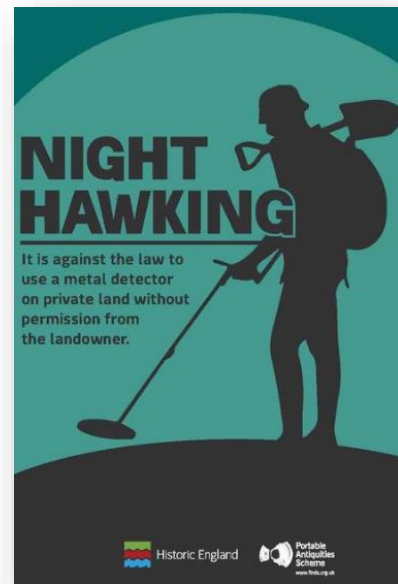

Operation Snap is a secure online platform that allows you to submit video evidence of driving offences that you or other members of the public have witnessed. Its purpose is to improve road safety and to prosecute those that place others at risk. The service has been produced with the support of the Department for Transport. The online service allows us to effectively deal with the footage recorded by members of the public in a safe and secure way, whilst making the investigation process simple and straightforward. We have a determined and robust approach to policing the roads and we'll take every opportunity to make them safer for everyone. This portal can only be used for driving offences, it is not for submitting footage of Road Traffic Collisions or public order offences, and is not for reporting crime.

It's easy for people to engage in Operation Snap and processes have been designed to run smoothly. Operation Snap is not asking you to go out and detect offences for us, but we will deal with any you find. [Operations Snap -Humberside \(egressforms.com\)](http://egressforms.com)

A 35-year-old man has been charged after we received reports of a burglary in Brandestburton yesterday (Monday 15 April). Daniel Davis, of St Quintin Park has been charged with burglary. He has been released on bail with conditions to appear at Hull Magistrates Court at a later date. It is believed that a man gained entry to an address on Catwick Lane and reportedly stole items of value before fleeing the scene.



Festival and concert goers looking to get last minute tickets to this summer's top events are urged to be on their guard against fraudulent sellers, as new data reveals £6.7 million was lost to ticket fraud last year. Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, has launched a ticket fraud awareness campaign, warning people to be alert to fraudsters trying to catch out people planning for popular and sold-out events. Last year more than 8,700 people reported they had been a victim ticket fraud, with a total of £6.7 million lost. This works out to an average loss of £772 per victim.

Specially trained officers from Operation Shield have been working hard to dismantle organised crime groups operating within the Humberside Police area.

Organised crime has the potential to affect every part of a community and it can take many forms – whether that be human trafficking, sexual exploitation or the importation of weapons, drugs or counterfeit goods.

Chief Constable Paul Anderson said: “We are here to serve, to protect and to keep people safe. Our focus on serious and organised crime across the Humberside Police area continues, as we work to dismantle organised crime groups.

“We remain committed to this by targeting those who cause the most harm in our communities, taking a proactive approach to arresting suspects and preventing crime through operations like Operation Shield.

“Organised crime groups prey on vulnerable people. Specialist teams across my force continue to work around the clock to protect those in our area who are vulnerable.”

Operation Shield returned for a four-week intensification period throughout March which focused on cracking down on crime in hotspot locations and relentlessly pursuing the harmful criminals in our region.

Any kind of persistent, unwanted contact that causes distress is stalking and is unacceptable. We would encourage anyone who thinks they are being stalked to report it to police straightaway, if you are in immediate danger call 999, otherwise you can report online or by calling 101.

A man remains in a critical condition in hospital following a collision near to Gilberdyke early this morning, Wednesday 24 April.

The incident happened shortly after midnight on the B1230 between Balkholme and Gilberdyke when a silver Peugeot 206 left the road before colliding with a tree.

Emergency services attended and a man was taken to hospital for treatment to serious and life-threatening injuries.

Anyone that witnessed the collision, or the car prior to the collision, or has dashcam footage from the area at this time is asked to call 101 quoting log 8 of 24 April.

Officers are appealing for information after a man died following a road traffic collision in Bridlington on Sunday 21 April.

We received reports at around 2.45pm that a white Citroen DS4 and a black Volkswagen transporter had been involved in a collision on Sewerby Road.

A 70-year-old man was taken to hospital where he died on Tuesday 23 April.

His family have been informed and our thoughts remain with them at this difficult time.

We would appeal to anyone who was in the area at the time and may have witnessed the incident, or, has CCTV or dashcam footage that may assist with our enquiries, to please call us on our non-emergency number 101 quoting log 283 of 21 April.

### My Community Alert

Do you want to find out what is happening in your local area?

Our community alert system, called My Community Alert, allows you to register to receive real time messages about incidents happening in your neighbourhood that may affect you or your family.

Sign up today - you can choose how you would like to receive messages (text, voicemail or email), how often you would like to receive alerts and which issues matter most to you, from collisions and road closures to missing people.

Find out more by visiting the [My Community Alert](#) website to sign up and start receiving alerts now.

As part of our Look Again campaign we are encouraging people to learn the signs of child sexual and criminal exploitation and 'look again' if something seems unusual, to help protect children and young people in our area.

One of the key signs which can indicate a child or young person is being exploited is if they regularly go missing from home or skip school, often in small groups.

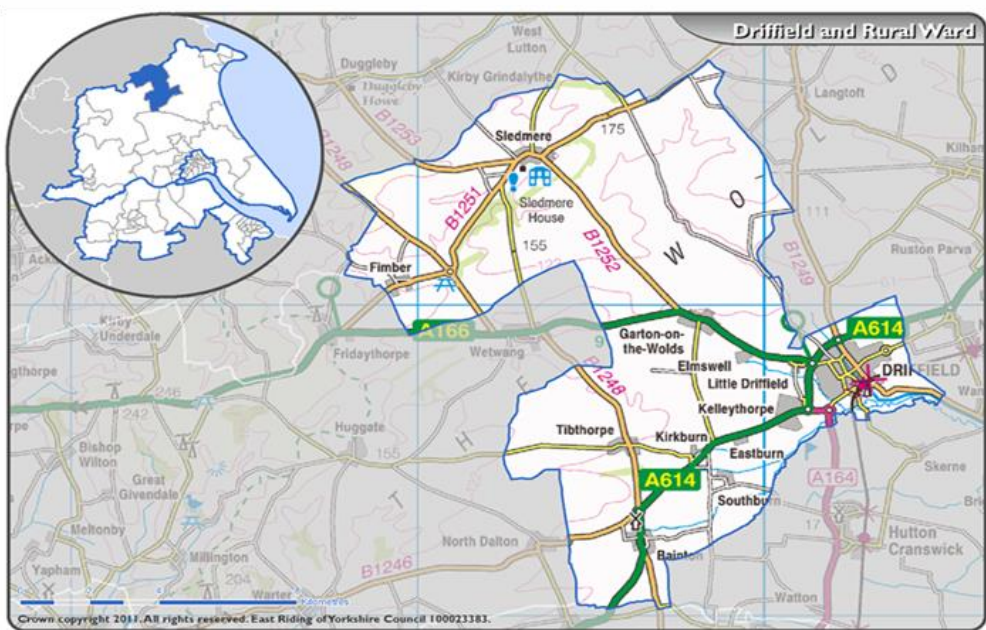

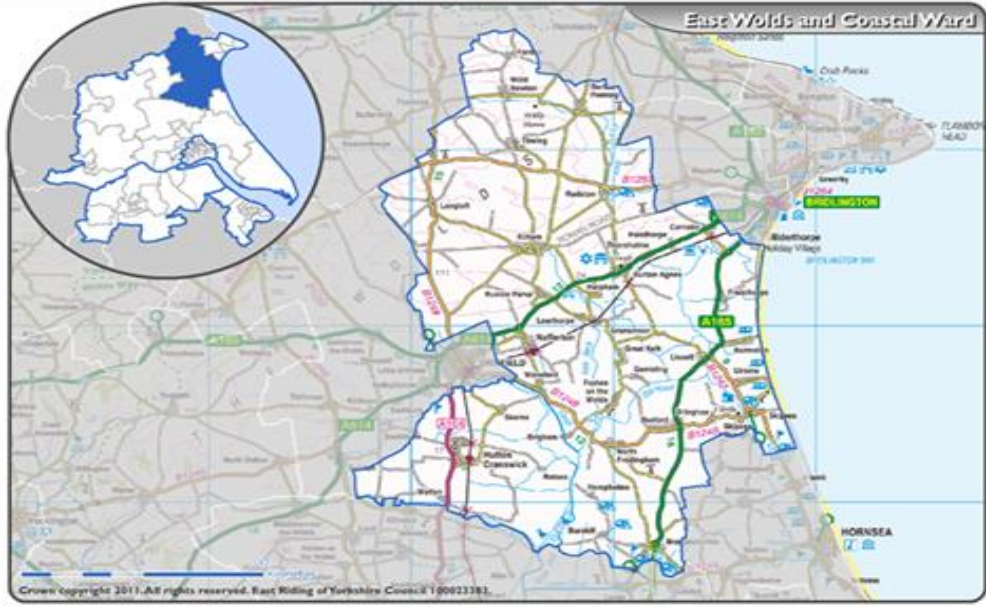
